A Decade of Excellence, hosting a lively, sold-out celebration of the accomplishments our organization and community have made since 2009. The evening connected old and new friends and honored some of the outstanding people who have contributed to the success of Building Energy Exchange (BE-Ex). The program timeline showcased our fifteen years of initiatives, resources, programs, awards and global impact. So much has changed since 2009. We've gone from an unfunded idea to a talented team that has established the Building Energy Exchange as an innovative international hub that is a model for other cities. We've already helped launch building resource hubs in Washington DC, St. Louis, Kansas

City, Chicago, Denver, Vancouver, with more in the pipeline.

Celebrate BE-Ex! was also a reminder of what an amazing community we have around us. Success is a collective achievement. In addition to the amazing Champions we honored that night, we have incredible industry partners, a pioneering board, and an amazing, hardworking, and dedicated staff.

As 2024 progressed, we continued to drive our mission forward, developing 68 incredible events attended by over 3,000 building decision-makers; reaching over 5,000 listeners through our Radio BE-Ex podcast; and we hosted nearly 150,000 sessions on our resource-rich website.

2024 also marked the 10th annual Daylight Hour social media campaign. Over 600 offices from 29 countries participated by dimming the lights in over 17.5 million SF of daylit office space around the world, sharing their participation on social media.

Looking forward, our <u>WISE</u> (Women in Sustainability and Energy) series will be celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2025, marking a decade of producing sold-out events featuring 115+ women leaders, attracting 3,300+ industry











# **Decarbonizing Your Building - Greenpoint Workshop**

November 18, 2024



The Decarbonizing Your Building Workshop initiative—developed in collaboration with Steven Winter Associates, Con Edison, NYSERDA, and the Association for Energy Afforadability—works with New York City Council Members to host free community workshops that will help educate and empower their constituents to make meaningful improvements to their residential buildings and meet City and State climate goals.

As part of this series, BE-Ex co-hosted a decarbonization workshop with District 33 Council Member Lincoln Restler in November. After hearing from industry professionals on financial incentives, resources, and best practices for building decarbonization, audiences engaged in a live Q&A and discussed in smaller breakout groups.



# High Rise Low Carbon Report

In October, Building Energy Exchange launched the "High Rise | Low Carbon Multifamily" report, developed in partnership with Level Infrastructure and Sustainable Energy Partnerships, and made possible with the generous support of NYSERDA.

New York's tall residential buildings pose a challenge in the transition to clean energy, as they possess a predominance of natural gas and oil-powered domestic hot water and steam heating systems.

This report explored a diverse set of retrofit projects that resulted in significant energy reduction, asking key questions such as:

- What GHG reductions are achievable?
- What building systems were upgraded?
- What technology was implemented?

# report High Rise / Low Carbon Multifamily

This report, developed with Level Infrastructure and Sustainable Energy Partnerships, highlights 14 tall residential buildings that underwent deep retrofits, achieving an average 33% reduction in energy use intensity through strategies such as passive house renovations and air-source heat pumps. These projects offer key insights for meeting New York City's Local Law 97 carbon reduction targets by 2030, as tall residential buildings accounted for 15% of the city's GHG emissions in 2022, making them vital to its decarbonization efforts.

### **Improved Standards for Building Investments**

BE-Ex, in collaboration with the Relay Network and the Building Performance Partnership, has developed principles and standards for investments in new buildings and building renovations made by the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF), a \$27 billion grant as part of the Inflation Reduction Act. The team worked across GGRF awardees to develop recommendations for building standards that could be implemented by the awardees, informing the development of their products and building their project pipelines. Clear principles and standards are needed to address variations in climates, building codes, and standards across the country, as well as to create clarity, reduce implementation and lending risks, and protect the people that GGRF intends to benefit.
